

Mission

PRISMS is dedicated to providing information and support to families of persons with Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) and foster partnerships with professionals to increase awareness and understanding of SMS. PRISMS is also committed to the support and promotion of research in the causes, optimal management and treatment of SMS.

About SMS

Smith-Magenis syndrome is a clinically recognizable chromosome microdeletion syndrome. It is caused by a missing piece (deletion) of part of number 17 chromosome (del 17p11.2). Ann C.M. Smith, M.A., D.Sc. (hon), a genetic counselor, and Ellen Magenis, M.D., a cytogeneticist first described SMS in the early 1980's.

Although the exact incidence is not known, it is estimated that SMS occurs in 1 out of 25,000 births. SMS is extremely underdiagnosed, but as awareness of it increases, the number of people identified grows every year.

2007 Highlights

- The Fifth International PRISMS Conference, "Building Bridges of Hope," was held May 10-13th, 2007, in Reston, VA. The conference was attended by over 300 persons, including families and professionals. New research, behavior management strategies, education

 - time and monetary investment for PRISMS for this program is of tremendous benefit to our families and professionals.

 The conference was preceded by the Research Roundtable where 50 professionals from many

disciplines convened to present new research about Smith-Magenis Syndrome and to

collaborate on research projects.

PRISMS continued to host an online SMS Discussion Forum or Bulletin Board. This great resource is designed to build a "knowledge base" for SMS – created by parents, professionals and people affected with SMS – to help and support each other. Information is well-

organized by category and topics to facilitate participation in online discussion and/or finding

- entries posted before.

 PRISMS initiated a new program using a special bookmark to raise awareness of SMS that features faces of children with SMS, common characteristics of SMS, and PRISMS information. These are distributed at the Conference, and available for members to distribute
- to schools, caretakers, and medical professionals in their community.

 Published PRISMS official newsletter, *Spectrum*, quarterly, with updated formatting and graphic design.
- Supported regional and international SMS family gatherings through advertising and follow-up articles in the PRISMS newsletter, *Spectrum*.
 A Holiday Greeting card featuring a picture of children with SMS was sent to members and donors as a year-end fundraising campaign.

Initiated or participated in several new fund-raising activities, including a fundraising picnic in California, silent auction at the Fifth International PRISMS Conference, 1st Annual 5K

Run & Carnival in Ohio, while continued with "Good Search" and "Birdies for Charity".
